

Care in the community expands

As our care in the community expands, we now have a range of outreach clinics across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland.

These offer patients the ability to meet with a specialist LOROS consultant. attend lymphoedema clinics, have complementary therapy or join bereavement support groups.

A selection of these services can now be accessed in Uppingham, Market Harborough, Hinckley, Melton Mowbray and Ashby, bringing our care closer to people at home.

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Trish and Rob's perfect day

As a nurse on the LOROS Ward for 12 years, Trish imagine she would find herself being supported by the Hospice when her husband, Rob, was given the

After a trip to A&E in May 2017, Rob (64) was told he had cancer in the lining of the lung and the diagnosis was terminal.

"We were in total denial. we just couldn't believe it," said 60-year-old Trish, of Glen Parva, who had been with Rob for 22 years.

By August, Rob's health had deteriorated and he was bought into LOROS for pain management.

"We thought he would only be on the Ward for a week," added mother-of-two and grandmotherof-three Trish. "I promised him it would only be a week but then his health got worse. Everything happened so quickly."



A Ward consultant asked them 'Why don't you get married?'

"Rob was a very private person, and because he was so poorly, he didn't really speak much," said Trish.

"But when the consultant mentioned getting married, he had the biggest beam on his face. That was it, the idea had been put in our heads."

With that, colleagues and friends immediately got the ball

rolling, helping to arrange her big day so she could continue being there for Rob.

"The support I received was just fantastic. People were coming in early to prepare for the wedding. Even the kitchen staff came in especially to make the cake.

Trish and Rob said 'I do' in the LOROS Chapel, before celebrating with friends and family in the Hospice's social area.





"The sun came out, it was just perfect. There wasn't a dry eye in the place," she said. "I will never forget what the nurses and team did for me."

Rob sadly died at LOROS, five days after they got married.

"Soon after we had said our vows. Rob mentioned that he was uncomfortable so I took him back to his room.

"That was it really; he didn't get any better from there."

Trish said she feels very fortunate to have married such a lovely man.

"It's great to finally be Mrs Felts," she added, "The nurses were so excited about creating me a name badge with my new surname on. It was the little things like that that meant such a lot to me."

All in a day's work

We are the LOROS housekeepers. There are six of us, and we are the people you'll meet first when arriving at the Hospice.

7am: Our first job is to make all of the patients on the Ward a cup of tea or coffee and provide them with fresh water. We continue to provide refreshments regularly throughout our working day.

7.30am: The team meets to discuss patient care and plan the day ahead. We meet with the nurse in charge, Ward

nurses, kitchen staff and the domestic team. Jobs are allocated depending on what has happened overnight and what patients we are expecting to arrive on the day.

8am: Following our morning catch-up, we're on our way to get bed spaces ready for new patients. We add their name to the board and





ensure the space is clean, tidy and fully equipped with everything they'll need.

9am: We go to reception to meet our first admission of the day, where we check their name, date of birth and fit a wristband to the patient. First impressions are key, and we make sure patients know where everything is and that they're comfortable.

10am: There's laundry to work through. We're off collecting dirty items to be washed and replenishing clean laundry where needed. We also do another tea round: this is to compliment the tea rounds our kitchen staff also do to ensure patients get plenty of drinks throughout the day.

12pm: A vital part of our role is to make sure supplies needed for patient care are well stocked. Anything that is needed on the Ward or in Day Therapy is ordered by us. We make sure everything is available when people need it.

2pm – 3pm: On

Wednesdays, we receive deliveries, and we put all the stock away in the correct place so it can be easily located.

6pm – 7pm: We're nearing the end of our working day now, and once we're satisfied everything is in top condition we can go home.



Did you know?

- Housekeepers are the first point of contact when patients and carers arrive at LOROS, ensuring that they are settled in and know where to find everything they need.
- Our housekeepers are available 365 days a year, to ensure the Ward is comfortable and clean.
- Most of our housekeepers have previously worked in a caring profession and will always make time to get to know our patients and their families.
- Our housekeepers help those who struggle to feed themselves and liaise with kitchen staff about any dietary requirements patients may have.
- Our housekeepers maintain vital supplies needed for patient care - this includes medical supplies, towels, staff uniforms and feeding apparatus.

Shantelle's story

Mother-of-three Shantelle is just 31. She has three children, aged 14, 13 and six. In February 2016, she was given the devastating news that she has terminal cancer. Here, she tells how LOROS is helping her cope with her diagnosis after her world was turned upside down.

"It all began in February 2015. I was diagnosed with breast cancer after I found a lump," said Shantelle Griffith, of Beaumont Leys, who was just 28 at the time.

"I had a mastectomy and radiotherapy and within months I was back to work. If I'm honest, I thought that was it, I would have my breast removed and Louid return to my normal life."

The following February, while Shantelle's family were planning a 'cancerfree party', she started to feel pains in her chest. After tests, Shantelle was told the cancer had returned; she had a tumour in her sternum. and it was terminal.

"I remember thinking, how can this happen to me at this age? Am I going



to die? Who is going to look after my children?" she said.

"It really did knock me for six."

Shantelle has now developed osteoporosis, meaning her

bones are becoming less dense and more fragile.

Over time. Shantelle said the pain had got worse, making her feel very sad.

as a mum. It's my kids that keep me going,

"As soon as I came to LOROS, I was able to be a mum again."

"I also feel like I'm failing they're so strong but it breaks my heart. This is having a massive effect on them too."

Her oncologist could see she was struggling, so referred her to LOROS for pain management.

"LOROS was exactly what I needed," said Shantelle,



who admits she was apprehensive about being admitted to a Hospice.

She said everyone made her feel so at ease. reassuring her it was OK to feel upset.

"At home, all of our emotions were running high, so we were arguing all of the time: I was at breaking point, but as soon as I came to LOROS. I was able to be a mum again.

"My kids can come and visit, and it's quality time. They've noticed a difference in me: l'm more chilled out now."

Shantelle likes the way LOROS staff talk to her as she sometimes struggles with being a young cancer patient.

"The staff don't treat all of the patients the same, they treat you like you're you, which is good because I am me, even though I have cancer," she added.

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RESEARCH AT LOROS

Richard Ill's tomb prompts big questions on death



Since May 2016, LOROS has been working with the University of Bradford on an Arts and Humanities Research Council-funded project, combining archaeology with end of life care.

During Dying Matters Week in 2017, the team held an exhibition at Leicester Cathedral, using

archaeological case studies to encourage reflection about death and its importance in all our lives.

Referring to the tomb of Richard III, people were asked 'How do you (re)bury a King?' and 'Are the bones still 'him' or just bones?'. Other big questions that people were asked to consider included: 'What actually is an ancestor?',

'Does how you die affect how you are remembered?', 'Is all death the same?', 'What is the respectful treatment of bones?', 'Why talk about death at all?'.

This was an interactive exhibition, where visitors responded to questions via post-its and feedback forms. They told us the exhibition was 'valuable, important and meaningful'. One person wrote about what they would take away: "I need to start writing my end of life wishes and sharing them with my family".

"I will never forget my wedding day, when my brother pushed dad down the aisle, so he could give me away. That was top of dad's bucket list, to give me away and he hung on for it."

Emily's father, Eddie Gardiner, was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease in May 2016. Following his diagnosis, Eddie started attending LOROS and accessing services.

"The team at LOROS were amazing from day one. We would have all felt very alone if LOROS hadn't been there," said Emily

Eddie's goal was to see Emily get married and he managed it. In June 2017, he was pushed down the aisle, before saying 'I do' as he was asked to give Emily away; they were two of the last words he ever spoke. "I will never forget that day," said 27-year-old Emily Humphrey, of Rutland.
