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COVID-19 A difficult year, but LOROS staff rise to challenge

What a year it's been for the Hospice. Despite all the restrictions and understandable concern caused by the pandemic, we have continued to deliver care to patients in all areas, from our Inpatient Ward to our Compassionate Neighbours service.

We have had to adapt to enable us to do this, but have ensured throughout that patients are, as always, at the heart of everything we do.

The Ward staff have supported patients in the same compassionate way they always do, despite the increased anxieties caused by COVID-19, including the restrictions of limited visits from loved ones, and the wearing of PPE.

Other team members. including physiotherapists, occupational therapists and our social worker, have also provided support to patients throughout the crisis.









Day Therapy staff have undertaken virtual sessions with patients, incorporating social activities and seated exercises in addition to regular phone 'check-ins', as well as the delivery of goody bags to every patient to boost their spirits.

During the national lockdowns, doctors and nurses carried out video consultations with patients both at the Hospice and in the community, seeing them face to face if needed, ensuring we continued to provide the best possible care.

Counsellors have undertaken sessions via video and phone, and our Compassionate Neighbour volunteers continued to provide phone support to patients.

The Chaplaincy team has been at the Hospice throughout, providing spiritual guidance for patients on the Ward and undertaking virtual events, such as Light up a Life, and Thanksgiving and Remembrance services.

In addition to supporting patients, our complementary therapists have also provided much needed therapy sessions for staff.

We have also supported the NHS in a variety of ways. Our Inpatient Ward has supported the hospital with discharges when patients with a terminal diagnosis were awaiting packages of care or care home placements in the community. Our doctors have worked at Leicester hospitals and undertaken outpatient clinics at the Hospice to support NHS colleagues, and some of our physiotherapists and occupational therapists have been redeployed to support the hospital and the community trust.



Our LOROS Local mobile resource centre also became part of a pop-up vaccination clinic at the Leicester Islamic Centre, in Highfields, Leicester, playing a key role in encouraging take up among people who are fasting for Ramadan. Future clinics utilising LOROS Local are planned in Coalville and Loughborough.

Despite the challenges faced by everyone during this difficult year, LOROS staff have done what they always do - deliver the best care possible to patients. We are grateful and proud of each and every one of them.

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COVID-19 How LOROS weathered devastating financial 'storm'

As the pandemic took hold of the country in March 2020, we guickly realised the devastating impact it was going to have on our traditional methods of generating income. All of our shops closed overnight, our events were cancelled and nearly all community events suffered the same fate.

Early estimations predicted a devastating drop in voluntary income of £2.3 million, which was later increased to £2.6 million when we included other sources, such as bank interest and dividend income.

We decided to inform our local communities of our financial challenge. We also chose not to launch an 'emergency appeal', as we saw the pandemic as a long-term problem and not one a swift emergency appeal could possibly answer.


Instead, our approach was to identify and pursue alternate sources of funding that were being created in different sectors: the Coronavirus Job Retention Furlough scheme, Coronavirus retail grants scheme and Hospice UK COVID-19 grant funding to name a few.

The relentless hard work from our income generation teams, and the overwhelming support of our local communities, who continued to fundraise for us in the most innovative of ways. meant that we were still able to bring in vitally needed income. This money, combined with the funds that we managed to source externally from COVID-19 related schemes, almost exactly matched the shortfall we predicted at the start of the pandemic.

It's a true testament to the strength of the organisation that LOROS continues to achieve financial stability during the most turbulent time in our history. Due to swift and decisive Hospice leadership, the amazing dedication of our staff and the overwhelming support of our local community, we have been able to emerge from the 'storm' in a solid financial position.

We're here for you, because of vou. We simply wouldn't be here without your continued support. Thank you.

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COVID-19 Our strategic response

When the COVID-19 pandemic hit, it was immediately obvious that its impact would have significant consequences for LOROS and our ability to deliver our services, raise income and fulfil our strategic intentions. The Senior Team, along with colleagues from across the organisation, began to plan and implement actions to re-stabilise our short-term activity, while continuing to pursue our longterm strategic ambitions.

As a result, a 'Plan on a Page' was created as an addendum to our 2020-23 Strategic Plan to give us a year-long strategic roadmap.



Organisation

Ensure the financial sustainability of the charity to deliver the range of clinical services by continuing to be prudent, review income levels and explore additional statutory fundina.

Clinical Services – **Hospice and Community**

Continually review clinical services and ensure that we safely support our patients by offering a range of options to attend the Hospice, face-to-face



visits, virtual sessions and/or telephone calls.

We will review the Inpatient Ward to ensure it is aligned with the expected patient demand.

Awareness, Income **Generation and Business** Development

Continually review, respond and innovate each income generation and commercial income stream to reduce the predicted loss of income, while maintaining the highest standards of supporter care.

Education and Research Deliver a programme of education and training which responds to the needs of staff within LOROS and across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. We will continue our research activity to ensure the successful delivery of the National Institute of Health Research grant.

Workforce

We will ensure we have a suitably trained staff and volunteer workforce to meet the demands of the changing world. We will continue to foster a positive working culture which has a proactive approach to equality, diversity and inclusion.



As we begin to enter the postpandemic world, we will continue to focus on intelligently using all the resources available to us. We will work with NHS colleagues to support local services and to deliver high-quality patient care, along with the aspiration to further expand our support into the community.

Despite the challenges that COVID-19 has presented to us, in the next issue of LOROS Matters we will showcase some of the amazing new initiatives that are already underway to fulfil our ambitions:

- The modernisation and expansion of the Hospice's social area and café to provide enhanced facilities for patients and their families.
- The establishment of our Compassionate Communities scheme in Market Harborough, with the aim of it becoming the first 'Compassionate Town' in the Fast Midlands.
- The appointment of a dedicated children's and young person's counsellor.

Seven-year-old Tonto came to see one of our patients, Hanya Gordon.

Hanya always loved horses and even had a pony when she was younger. More recently she supported donkey sanctuaries and filled her room at the Hospice with donkey pictures.

Hanya had progressive multiple sclerosis and first came to LOROS a few years ago for counselling. She staved on the Ward several times over the years, which made a huge difference to her ability to cope with her illness.

Her dad, Bob, said: "We all felt LOROS has done more for her than anyone. She came in for pain management several times and it recharged her

batteries, kept her going. She was cared for so well by LOROS, it was such a weight off my shoulders."

Hanya was seeing her LOROS counsellor, Tracey Hughes, once a month when the COVID-19 pandemic struck and all appointments were forced online. By October she had taken a turn for the worse. Bob contacted Tracey, once more.



Tracey said: "I could see that LOROS was a godsend for Hanya. It provided the time she needed and allowed her dad to be her dad again and not her carer. She always wanted to check he was okay - they have a very strong relationship. So LOROS makes a real difference to her."

Hanya's donkey pictures in her room gave LOROS Nurse Tracey Canham the idea of arranging the VIP visitor to







see Hanya. Tonto, who loves carrots, was very friendly and patient and seemed to enjoy his visit.

Bob said: "She's always loved horses from when she was five years-old. I've got a lovely picture of her with her arms around a pony. That passion stayed with her all her life, a real constant.

Despite having multiple sclerosis and no longer being able to talk, Hanya managed to share how much Tonto's visit had meant to her. Sadly Hanya died a few weeks after Tonto's visit.

After a competitive tender, LOROS was awarded the

contract to provide refreshments to Leicester Crown Court staff and visitors.

I OROS has taken over ownership of Peppercorns Catering Ltd, which operates cafés at Abbey Park and Anstey as well as an outside catering contract. We've also won a catering contract with the University of Leicester and have a growing property portfolio.

LOROS also has its Care for a Drink van, a mobile coffee shop which serves a range of beverages and snacks.

Anna Shutt, Business Development Lead, said: "LOROS is using the sale of land we have been gifted to fund the purchase of these commercial enterprises.

"They provide a useful service to our community, as well as creating a profit which we use to fund our care for patients. It's a win/win!"
