LOROS is a Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland charity which is wholly dependent upon local people for financial and volunteering support. LOROS Local is a tool for sharing the goals and aspirations of the Hospice, for promoting the principles of palliative care and explaining the many caring roles performed by the Charity.

### **Key Volunteer duties**

- Travel on or meet up with LOROS Local at a designated location for a negotiated period of time.
- Ensure that the information pod leaflets are topped up, setting out additional information leaflets/booklets as supplied.
- Offer information, support and advice to those coming onto LOROS Local regarding hospice services.
- As required, take appropriate details of individuals and pass on to a relevant colleague to advise.
- Assist with the documenting and monitoring of aspects of visitor activity for data collection purposes to enable the development of the service.
