MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTS

Pickle Illustration

What inspired your design?

Our design is inspired by the hosiery factories that led the 'Leicester Clothes the World' industrial period which spanned from the 1930s until the 1970s. We researched factory life for the women working in Leicester and their stories inspired the illustrations. You see a machinist 'badge of honour' earned when they get their first needle injury, them decorating the factory for Christmas and the hard-working women who 'clothed the world'.

Tell us more about your work as an artist!

Pickle Illustration is a creative design agency based in the Midlands formed by Lauren Jeffries and Olivia Collins. Our aim is to develop creative ways of connecting people. We create bespoke artwork for public areas with the aim of turning spaces into places which strengthen communities and build a sense of belonging. We also bring personality to communications through bespoke animations, promotional material or illustration for branding.

What did you enjoy most about being a Rocket Round Leicester Artist?

It was so great being part of a project that involved so many other local creatives. Lauren grew up in Leicester and went to De Montfort University so it was amazing to be sponsored by them. There was a real community feeling between the artists and it was inspiring to see the other designs. We can't wait to see how much of an impact they have on the streets of Leicester.

What inspired your design?

My design showcases the incredible work that the University of Leicester and the National Space Centre are doing with their space research programme. It's a ground breaking area and my design explores it in an abstract way.

Arch Creative have also made my Rocket into an augmented reality experience that they can take away with them and put into their own environment.

Tell us more about your work as an artist!

My main interest is in exploring the colour field. I use a signature colour palette of extremely bright and intense hues which make my work recognisable. I explore tone and texture through portraiture and architectural paintings. I use a variety of mediums and subvert traditional and contemporary methods of application with brushes, aperture caps and marker paint mops to orchestrate purposeful and dynamic designs.

What did you enjoy most about being a Rocket Round Leicester Artist?

I was really keen to be involved in this project. Firstly for the charity, but also because it was something different. I like to push myself and try new things. A 2 metre Rocket is something I've not done before! It helped me to look at art in a different way. **SMALL STEP**

1 SENT WITH LOVE

About the Rocket

Emma's Rocket is shooting off to space with a universal message of love, peace and kindness.

About the artist

Emma is 44 and a wife and mum. She enjoys creating bright happy paintings that make people smile. Throughout her art, Emma loves using bold colours and lines to make her pictures pop. Her recent sculpture 'Life's a Beach' formed part of the Ty Hafan Snowdog trail.

2 RETRO ROCKET

About the Rocket

Mik's first thought upon seeing the sculpture was that it reminded him of the fabulous retro rockets of the Flash Gordon era that were made into the iconic lava lamp. The Rocket is hand painted with a multitude of colours to look like glowing blobs and bubbles that we all recognise.

About the artist

Mik Richardson is a Norfolk based artist who has ran his own art business since leaving the RAF in 2006. As well as producing over 400 murals, privately, in the community and in schools, he has also been involved in many public art trails across the country. To date, he has painted 77 Wild in Art sculptures (plus an additional 26 for other trails) which have raised over £300,000 for charity. He also works with communities creating over 100 smaller sculptures for the trails alongside various other projects. He recently illustrated his first children's story book based around one of his sculptures.

3 BIRDS OF THE CITY

About the Rocket

Helen's Rocket is inspired by the birds that live in the city of Leicester. The design has a stylised landscape and sky that swirls around the Rocket from night to day and back again, suggestive of the continuation of daily life. There were periods of time during 2020, when there was such a significant reduction in the number of people in the City, that the birds had it almost all to themselves. The Cathedral peregrines, mute swan and moorhen on the river, the barn owl that she hears screeching in the evening outside her house, the ever amusing feral pigeons and the popular robin all feature.

About the artist

Helen is a wildlife illustrator who is both entertained and inspired by wildlife just going about its own business. Nature adapts to its environment and finds a way to survive and just keep going which Helen believes is a good lesson for all of us. Her images are not a true representation, but a stylised, often endearing version of the real thing. Helen has spent 14 years designing Christmas lights displays for Leeds City Council, completed her degree in Illustration, worked on a casual basis for Leicester Museums and raised her cute twin baby boys into noisy teenagers.

4 ROCKY ROAD ROCKET

About the Rocket

About the artist

Megan Heather Evans is a Birmingham based tattooist and artist, focusing mainly on sculpture painting and pet portraiture. After completing her Fine Art degree at Birmingham School of Art, Megan went on to complete her apprenticeship in tattooing and has tattooed full time for the past five years. As well as tattooing, Megan takes on various commission work including pet portraiture and enjoys large-scale acrylic painting, working on many sculptures around the country for various art trails.

5 DAVID'S FLORA AND FAUNA

About the Rocket

Inspired by Sir David Attenborough this Rocket pays tribute to his work by featuring animals and plants named after Attenborough (even a constellation!). The Rocket aims to raise awareness for endangered species.

About the artist

Caroline Coates is an artist who is inspired by working with people. She is an illustrator, community artist and craft tutor and specialises in getting people interested in art and to help them create their own. Mainly working in Manchester, Caroline's illustrations mix the traditional and contemporary to tell a story.

6 MAJOR TOM

About the Rocket

Inspiration for this design came when Sally initially thought about space, and in this case, the space 'inside' the Rocket and how to fill it. After designing a 'virtual' window to see inside, a fish tank evolved complete with curious cat. Sally explains that the name of 'Major Tom' actually came afterwards, and suddenly it all made sense!

About the artist

Former London prop-maker, Sally later studied art in Taunton, Norwich, and Cambridge. She's worked on countless art projects, and has public commissions in Norfolk. Sally also won the EDP GoGoGorilla design competition in 2013, and has worked on Wild in Art trails nationwide ever since. For fun, she's also #TheDuckorator, decorating large sponsored ducks for Break Charity duck races.

About the Rocket

Amrit's design is inspired by nature, space and the rich, diverse culture within Leicester. The lotus flower is a symbol of enlightenment, self-regeneration and rebirth along with nature inspired artwork. Amrit's design is a nod to the greenery in the city.

About the artist

Amrit Singh is an award-winning artist and creates notable intricate InkANIMA art using various mixed media techniques and vivid colour. His art is a salute to nature's beauty, mixed with inspiration from various world cultures and amplified thorough rich textures, mesmerising line work and impressive story telling. His art has been featured in over 25 exhibitions across the UK and USA and is sold all over the world. Amrit has previously designed sculptures for city art trails.

9 PATCH

About the Rocket

Patch is inspired by Leicester's links to the textile industry. It is designed to look like a patchwork of different printed textiles from a range of cultural references. The design is bright and detailed, to encourage the viewer to be drawn in and take a closer look.

About the artist

Lucy (Lucy Loves Design) is a surface pattern and printed textile designer. She graduated from Loughborough University School of Art and Design with a First-Class Honours degree in Printed Textile Design. Loving to draw, paint, collage and explore new ways of making patterns, Lucy's work is inspired by the natural world and always starts with hand drawn or painted motifs. These are then developed into digitalised print concepts for fashion, home furnishings, interior products, stationary and wallcoverings. When Lucy isn't designing, she passes on her love of learning by teaching art and design in a Leicestershire secondary school.

10 HOPES, DREAMS AND WISHES

About the Rocket

The fox motif is something that recurs in many of Lynne's artworks and illustrations. Her late father was a farmer and he kept a pet fox, so the fox, and what it represents, resonates strongly. Lynne believes the fox is synonymous with inquisitiveness, playfulness and conveys magical qualities. Foxes also have a strong family bond. This Rocket features a family of foxes looking to the sky. The butterflies represent their hopes, dreams and wishes which turn into stars. This design has a playful, thoughtful and symbolic narrative.

About the artist

Lynne Hollingsworth is an award-winning artist, designer and mural artist. Lynne is head of the HD Art Creative Studio where she works predominantly on mural design and illustration projects. She has co-ordinated many large-scale arts events and work son hospital projects across the UK. After graduating with a BA (Hons) Fine Art, Lynne worked as an Art Gallery Exhibitions Officer and Art Curator. Following her postgraduate study, she worked as a Head of Art and Design, a Head of Graphics and a co-ordinator for Advanced Art and Design Studies. After teaching, Lynne set up HD Art Creative Studio in 2002. Lynne supports the creative industries as a mentor, trainer and keynote speaker. Lynne was invited to exhibit her artwork personally for HRH Prince of Wales.

11 DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION

About the Rocket

Adam's Rocket celebrates diversity and inclusion. His vision was to create artwork that is visually appealing, and provides a bold ethnic statement for the wider community. The process of Indian/ Arabic design is used on black background. The Rocket has two faces, which join at the centre; this creates a Yin and Yang effect to show that the pattern is exclusive and inclusive at the same time.

About the artist

Adam is currently working as a Fine Artist at studionAme and has over eight years freelance Graphic Design experience. As a creative, from Leicester he is influenced by diversity and community culture within the working class environment. His vision is to remain neutral and deliver direct but open message(s). The delivery of his work focuses on cultural, religious and political dialogue. The idea is to challenge current ideas and concepts and open new questions. Ultimately, Adam's outlook is to capture diversity and bring a body of work together for the wider community.

After graduating with an HND in 2D Animation, she has been working as a freelance illustrator and workshop provider since 2007. Katy's work covers a range of subjects including; greetings/ handmade cards, book illustration, cartoons, pet portraits, plush prototype designing/making, murals, private commissions and teaching art workshops to primary school children. Katy has a passion for creating and often works with recycled organic materials. She also loves to read, garden, and can often be found wandering the fields, sketching!

13 LEICESTARRY NIGHT

About the Rocket

Anna was due to visit the Van Gogh interactive exhibition, but it was delayed due COVID-19. Anna felt it was a fitting sentence to the world and specifically Leicester having to endure such a long lockdown period. Her design combines Leicester's skyline with the starry night background and a poem written by her daughter titled 'Hope is in the stars'.

About the artist

Anna lives in Leicester, works for LOROS and studied Visual Arts at University. Her path changed when she married and had a family when she continued to paint and draw as a hobby when her children were small. Once they grew older, Anna began to pick up her paint brushes again to create set designs for local productions. Anna also designs costumes and paints for commissions. She mainly works with acrylics but draws and creates brush paint lettering on signs for craft markets. Anna likes her work to have a story behind it that people can connect with. During COVID-19, she has reconnected with art.

About the Rocket

Jenny has made the body of the Rocket into a huge jukebox! The jukebox buttons show songs about space and the moon, including; Moondance by Van Morrison, Space Oddity by David Bowie and Fly Me to the Moon by Frank Sinatra.

About the artist

Jenny is a community driven commission artist always pursuing collaborative art projects that bring people together. She currently draws live illustrations for virtual online events whilst also taking illustration and painting commissions. Specialising in murals and site specific public art for the community, she has exhibited over 60 sculptures on art trails and has raised over £180,000 for partnering charities.

15 STARDUST

About the Rocket

Stardust was inspired by Leicester's heritage of space. Julie wanted to create a sense of the movement of particles and cosmic dust floating through space. Julie chose a reflective colour palette of white and silver to create the magical shimmer and sparkle you get from stars. Julie is interested in creating different tones from using one colour base. In this design, Julie used five different shades of white glass and four types of silver to create pattern and depth.



About the artist

17 ROCKET KING - RICHARD III

About the Rocket

King Richard III, the last of the Plantagenet Kings, died during the War of the Roses in the Battle of Bosworth Field, Leicestershire in 1485. Over half a millennium later, the remains of the medieval king were famously uncovered by archaeologists under a car park in Leicester City centre. Donna has transformed the Rocket sculpture into a portrait of the King and depicts him wearing England's Royal armour under his cloak and crown whilst carrying his flag embellished with white boar and rose emblems. A playful caricature of the Car Park King.

About the artist

Donna Newman is a freelance mural artist. Predominantly working in schools across the Midlands, she seeks to inspire young people by transforming their learning environments with her vibrant artwork. She is also an experienced painter of public art trails working closely with Wild in Art on numerous commissions and raising over £150,000 for charities through her sculpture sales. Trained as a painter at Coventry University, Donna works in numerous locations and on various surfaces to bring colour and life to her designs.

18 BOGSWAMP


About the Rocket

22 DIVERSE-CITY

About the Rocket

This Rocket depicts elements of the built environment in Leicester, some well known, some not so well known. They have been chosen by Anita to illustrate a variety of architectural styles and uses. The elements have been positioned so that different characteristics sit adjacent to one another. Anita believes that all of these differences make up the beautiful mosaic that is Leicester.

About the artist

Anita is an artist and architectural and interior designer based in Leicestershire. Her work as a designer heavily influences her art with the use of clean lines and controlled colour palettes spanning both her artistic and spatial designs. Although the majority of Anita's work is figurative, she explains that she doesn't practice photorealism and instead opts for simplification to produce a more minimalist result.



About the Rocket

This design is inspired by the hosiery factories that led the 'Leicester Clothes the World' industrial period which spanned from the 1930s until the 1970s. Drawing on research found in the Leicester University Affective Digital Histories, Olivia and Lauren (Pickle Illustration) became interested in the factory life for women working in Leicester City. They listened to audio files of the women who worked in the factories to inspire their illustrations.

Their design features a machinist 'badge of honour' for workers first needle injury, decorating the factory for Christmas and the hard-working women who 'clothed the world'.

About the artist

Both Midlands born, Olivia and Lauren met at Loughborough University whilst studying Graphic Communication and Illustration. Wanting to become freelance illustrators, they teamed up to together to bring Pickle Illustration into the world. Their aims include helping local businesses and communities have a creative edge. Olivia and Lauren have worked on many projects including; mural and painted sculptures for Fosse Park, A Thank You Postcard for the MET Office, Illustrations for Leicester's Journeys Festival and illustrations for Explora Children's Festival in Rome. 38 WOVEN INTO SPACE

About the Rocket

Christina's Rocket captures the story of the space age weavers. Women used their skills to weave the core rope memory for computers that sent the 1960s US Apollo missions into space. Wires were meticulously woven by hand and machine in a Binary pattern which formed the computer programmes.

The Os and 1s of Binary code are reflected in the design with the weaver's hands sending the Rocket into space. Light shines through lines and dots adapted from a repeat textile design. Christina believes the story connects to Leicester's past textile heritage and emerging reputation as the UK's Space City.

About the artist

Christina's design process involves building layers of imagery created by projecting light sources through everyday objects. With a DIY/punk attitude to exploring what can be created from what you have to hand, re-using and repurposing materials is an important driver for the work: reducing waste and ensuring sustainability. Her inspiration comes from what's happening in society, stories of people, place and connections and the unexpected and absurd in life, art, performance and film. Christina likes to create work with and for the community and explores emotional attachment to objects, the psychology of nostalgia and the sense of wellbeing.

To accelerate learning, all participants enjoyed an imaginative Resource Pack produced by LOROS Hospice together with the Rocket Round Leicester Learning Programme Partners, the National Space Centre, Leicester City Council and Leicester City in the Community.

The fun didn't stop there, each school and group continued to reach for the stars and raise vital funds for LOROS Hospice. We were blown away that Leicester Grammar Junior School raised an astonishing £8,000 – and counting! The fundraising activities really have been as varied and creative as the Junior Jets themselves; from selling rocket shaped ice lollies on a sunny day to astronaut training, themed sports days and even a sponsored head shave!

The Sun Power Rocket reflects the positivity, friendship and creativity valued in our school. We are very excited to be part of the Rocket Round Leicester project and raise money to help LOROS continue their incredible work.

This Junior Jet was designed by pupils from Hartshill School, part of the Midland Academies Trust, and it represents their communities. The teacher and pupils looked at key elements that have shaped the world recently and how the power of science and community has helped us all through it. They were also inspired by the links of DNA and forensic fingerprinting from Leicester and wanted to celebrate this. The DNA helix shows that our basic elements are all the same. The use of COVID inspired fingerprints is to show that we are using science and working together to beat the pandemic. They also represent how the cycle of life continues as the butterfly emerges from the fingerprint cocoon so will we from the pandemic. The butterfly's rainbow colours both pay tribute to our health care professionals, including those working tirelessly at LOROS and our wonderfully diverse community. Their local and wider community help to shape and nurture the pupils, by supporting in times of need and celebrating successes. It is a strong and truly diverse community allowing pupils to be their true self. This is celebrated through the design.


